## **Thank You**

For the over 20 years that I taught school, I had a ritual to end the school year. I made an effort to meet, or visit, with all my kids teachers, simply to say thank you for making the school year a positive one for them. Knowing what teachers go through in a myriad of situations throughout the school year, I just wanted them to know they were appreciated. Teachers, in my opinion, don't get thanked enough.

This year, the ritual has taken on a newer and greater significance. My son, Max, who is approaching his 21<sup>st</sup> birthday, is getting ready to leave the classroom entirely, and enter the workplace. Max, you may remember, is autistic. He has been in special programs since he entered the school district. He has been in purely special education programs, in self-contained classrooms with a blended population of special and normal education students, and in mainstreamed general education settings with resource help and aids. He matriculated from both elementary and middle-schools, and nearly four years ago, Audrey and I, and all his brothers and sisters, had the immense pride of watching him walk in graduation ceremonies from Desert Oasis High School. From there, he entered the CCSD's Post Program that allows him to continue his studies, and socialization skills until he is one-day short of his 22<sup>nd</sup> birthday.

And this year he ends the formal classroom journey. For the remaining year of the Post Program, Max will work in a number of jobs and work-settings, while the program evaluates where he can work best, and then will help place him in a regular job, where he will earn normal pay, and be productive. He has always liked school, and has truly expanded his horizons. He has gone from having an aid constantly at his side to make sure he got from place to place at school, to a young man who takes the bus to school, and comes home, carrying his keys and his cell phone; who lets himself into the house when we are not home to greet him, and then texts me to tell me he got in safely. So for all his teachers, administrators and classroom aids who got him this far, I can only thank them for all they have done to get Max to this point.

But I have much more to thank them for than simply teaching Max things. Everyday when Max went to school, he was surrounded by his friends the minute he walked onto the school yard. He had a cadre of buddies that walked with him all over whatever school he attended. Taylor, who preceded Max by a year in both elementary and middle schools called him "Mr. Popularity." I once was walking our dogs with Max in our neighborhood when he was in high school. Coming towards us were two extremely beautiful young ladies who waved to him and yelled, "hi Max." I asked him who these very cute girls were. He told me, "they help me everyday get from my class to the gym for P.E."

These kids, and many other teachers, aids and administrators have, for over 15 years, been exhibiting the profound Judaic concept of *hakhnasat or'khim*, kindness to strangers. In Torah, in Genesis, Abraham sits outside the door of his tent waiting for guests, strangers, to arrive. When he sees the strangers, he runs to greet them and have them to his tent for a meal and schmoozing. The children and others greeted Max every morning, just as Abraham did. Abraham offered his strangers sanctuary from the heat of the desert – he offered them food, and a place to sit and rest, even washing their feet. The children offered sanctuary to Max. Max could play games, and could simply laugh and talk whatever jibberish he felt like, without fear of being made fun of. Since the strangers had nothing with them, they were poor, and were welcomed as if they were kings. Max may have been “poor” in his ability to communicate on a “normal” basis at school; but at the same time, he was made to feel rich in terms of his interaction with those around him. He was included in everything.

The Talmud teaches us that if you visit a sick person, just the visit alone will take away 1/60 of their disease. While Max is not sick, those that “visited” with him helped him to heal just that much more each day. And those that visited were healed as well by having a rich spirit.

All those children, and Max, healed me as well. I have been now for a number of years been much more conscious of the poor, the sick, the homeless, the abused; all those who have no one to speak for them. In *Isaiah* we are taught, “He will judge the destitute with righteousness, and decide with fairness for the humble of the earth. The wolf will live with the sheep, and the leopard will lie down with the kid; and a calf, a lion whelp and a fatling will walk together, and a young child shall lead them. (11:4,6)

I hope, like me, you see through them a glimpse into a beautiful world that the prophet speaks of. If we could only put into practice what the Prophet talks about, and apparently what young children already understand, the world we yearn for in *Aleinu*, God’s kingdom, a perfect world, will come true, and speedily in our time!

In the Talmud, the Rabbis argue about how, and when the Messiah will come. Many say Elijah will blow the great shofar to announce His coming. One though argues that He may already be here, and you will find him at the gate in Jerusalem where the lepers hang out, changing their bandages. Many Rabbis protest in disgust that the Messiah would not do such a disgusting job. But that Rabbi argues, what else would the savior of the world be doing?

For all that these children have done, and learned, and indeed, taught; I can only, and simply say, *todah rabbah g'dolah!* (A very big thank you.)

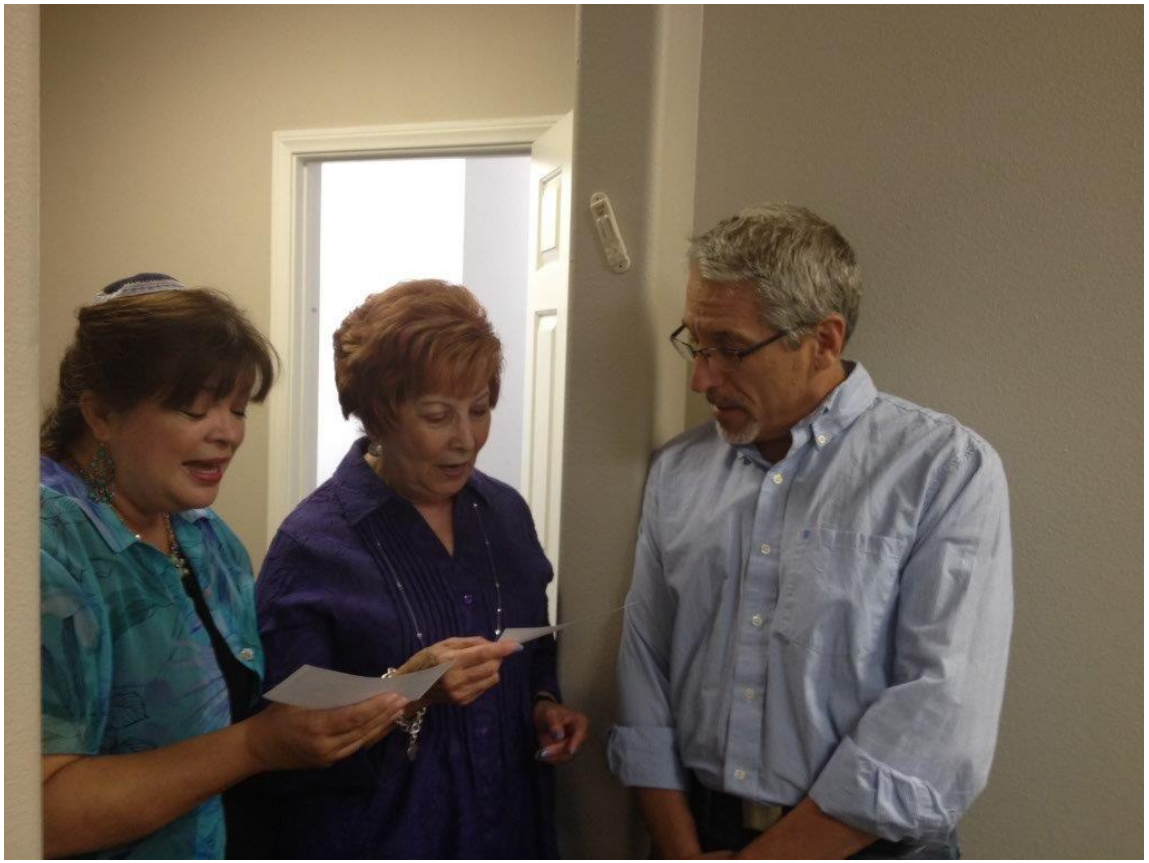

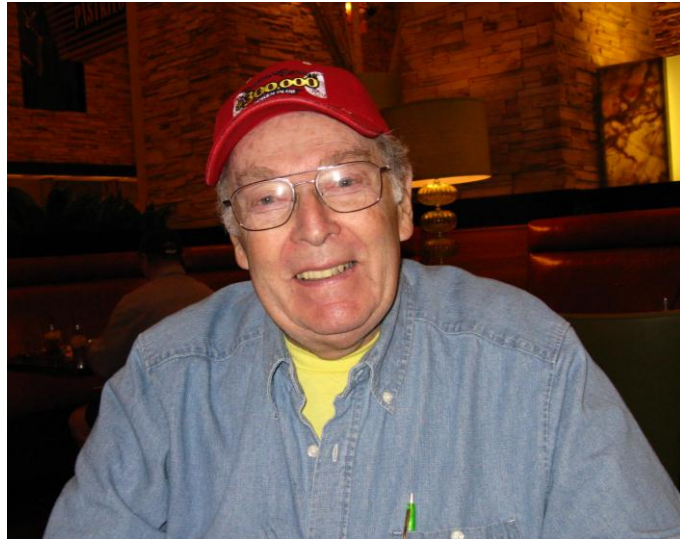
